Dear Rogue Valley Genealogical Society Members and Supporters,

Thank you for making 2017 another successful year! Our membership grew to over 830 members with over 14,000 volunteer hours recorded, and thanks to generous donations to the Annual Fund Drive, we surpassed the goal set by the Roard!

In addition, in 2017, RVGS held another successful seminar, *Gateway to Germany*. We installed the long-awaited acoustic quality accordion doors in our meeting room, partially funded by a grant from the Jackson County Cultural Coalition, which created two meetings spaces! We received a large donation of books from the Barbara Freshwater estate and second large donation from a woman battling cancer, while successfully holding a surplus book sale that netted over \$1900 for the library. Our library now houses over 19,000 items! We added a subscription website to our patron computers called HistoryGeo.com. Our public programs are now being video recorded and made available on YouTube under *Stories of Southern Oregon; and we* added a new interest group, Genetic Genealogy. All-in-all, a busy and fruitful year.

Why donate? In place of a variety of rummage and bake sales, RVGS holds one main fund raiser each year, our Annual Fund Drive. This year, our Annual Fund goal is \$16,000. Your generous contribution to the Annual Fund will allow RVGS to keep our membership dues low and assist in covering operating expenses. Membership dues only cover about one-third of our operating expenses. The remaining expenses are covered by monies raised through our Annual Fund Drive. Any amount you give will help to provide support to RVGS to continue the current level of programming. See the back side of this letter for the many services RVGS provides.

- RVGS promotes family history research by providing educational and research opportunities at our Jackson County Genealogy Library (JCGL) and through our two websites, rvgsociety.org and rvgslibrary.org, which provide a growing number of indexes and databases for Jackson County.
- RVGS maintains the largest privately-owned genealogy library between Portland and Sacramento. The JCGL has an extensive collection of birth, marriage, and death records; family histories, books, bulletins, cemetery records, obituaries, local maps, microfilm and microfiche, and newspaper abstracts for every state and many countries.
- RVGS is an all-volunteer organization that is thriving without public funding.
- RVGS has almost 100 dedicated volunteers serving over 830 members.
- RVGS has served all of the Jackson County community for over 50 years.
- RVGS houses over 19,000 items in the library, all catalogued online.
- RVGS hosts multiple genealogy subscription websites available for research on 15 computers in the library.
- RVGS sponsors regular public historical and genealogical programs.
- RVGS offers genealogy classes on a range of topics for beginners to experts.
- RVGS publishes a monthly e-newsletter with valuable information regarding classes and genealogy research.
- RVGS sponsors a variety of projects and programs including: Historic Cemeteries, Survey Maps and Records, Pioneer and Early Settler Certificates and Files, and the Historic

and Genealogical Quilt Collection.
